


DEMOGRAPHIC BREAKDOWN

"Homie" Pronounced ("Hō-Mē"):


"Homie" is a term used to describe an individual who is actively engaged in a network or community where "life essential" resources and services are exchanged. Life essential resources, for us, are those resources which not only improve a person's quality of life, but make life enjoyable! The term homie can refer to someone offering this resource, seeking this resource, or sponsoring resources so as to further the fight to revive community. Whether you are the provider of a valuable resource, the seeker of a much needed service, or the recipient of aid, remember this: we are all the homies. A homie cares. A homie collaborates. A homie provides access. Home is where our Homies are.

According to our target population the identified barriers create service deficits that act as "roadblocks" in their ability to access critical resources.








FREEDOM TO MOVE

The theme for our 2024 Summer Homies Festival was Freedom to Move. In 2024 we wanted to remove one of the BIGGEST barriers, transportation, by donating 2 vehicles to 2 families. Without a car, simple tasks like grocery shopping or attending parent-teacher meetings can become daunting challenges. A donated car can restore a sense of independence and dignity, allowing parents to fulfill their responsibilities and pursue opportunities that were previously out of reach.

- Donating a car can also break the cycle of poverty by enabling parents to secure and maintain steady employment. This financial stability can have a ripple effect on the entire family, providing stability and improving overall well-being.
- Moreover, a donated car represents more than just a mode of transportation—it symbolizes a community "of homies" coming together to support another "homie" in their time of need.

Hey Homies!


