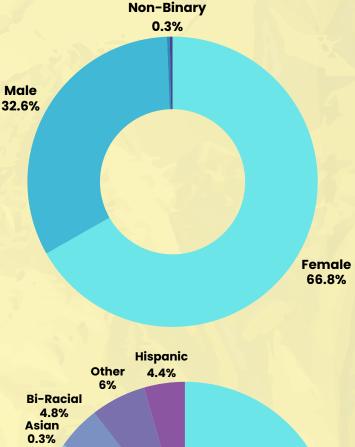

Overcomer Scholarship





This year at Summer Homies 2025, ten (10) community applicants each received \$10,000 in scholarships (totaling \$100,000 in scholarship give-aways). Scholarships can be used at any Virginia trade school or program. Recipients without a GED will have an opportunity to participate in our community Educational upward mobility program which aims to help individuals improve their social and economic standing through education and related support services. Through this program, we will walk the recipient through the process of qualifying for admission, applying to the trade school and ultimately being admitted.
